Vale Roger 'Cookie' Cook 15/2/1943-23/5/2010

Cookie loved to ride. He had been riding bikes since the age of 18. Every Friday and Saturday afternoon, he would take his son, Philip (11) on the bike, from Gepps Cross to Port Adelaide, to go fishing. They would only leave once they had caught enough fish for tea or ran out of bait.

Cookie rode to football matches every Saturday he played, sometimes playing in 2 games per day.

Cookie bought the Harley in 2008, but Lorraine would not ride pillion. So, he put a side-car on so he and his wife could go travelling. They went to Port Lincoln a few times, Port Vincent many times - just loved it! He was very proud of the Harley that he had always wanted.



Cookie also loved the sea and had many boats. Since 1985, he was a member of Sea Rescue, then after moving to Tiddy Widdy, he and Lorraine became radio operators with Sea Rescue.

They then started their own club -Ardrossan Sea Searchers - that has been running for approximately 15 years.

Better known in the Yorke Peninsula area, Cookie was a likeable character, always laughing and joking. When he joined Ulysses a couple of years ago, his enthusiasm for all things 'Ulysses' was infectious.

Cookie passed away after a short illness at the Maitland Hospital.
