

## **President's Annual Report 2026**

The year 2025 was a strong and positive one for the Adelaide Branch. A major highlight was hosting the 31st South Australian Odyssey in Jamestown, which proved to be a resounding success. This event would not have been possible without the tremendous efforts of our dedicated volunteers, who generously gave their time and energy.

Our October meeting featured a special guest, David Johnson, organised by Graham Paull. The evening was very well received and attracted members from several other branches, strengthening inter-branch connections and engagement.

The Four Captains Ride was successfully revived following a suggestion from Guy Malpas, which I presented at the 2024 Inter-Committee Meeting. The concept involved separate rides converging at a single location for a combined lunch. The Fleurieu Branch embraced the idea and delivered a very successful event. In 2026, it will be the Adelaide Branch's turn to host this ride.

Our first meeting for 2026 was held on New Year's Day and saw increased attendance, including members from the Yarra Ranges Branch who were passing through on their way to the Flinders Ranges. It was a pleasure to share stories and experiences with them.

Ride Coordinator Rob Hartridge has continued to ensure our Sunday rides run consistently, supported by a committed group of ride leaders. Wednesday rides also remain well attended. Friday dinners, organised by Michelle Stevens, continue to be popular and well supported.

The SA Breakfast Club remains strong and continues to attract members from a variety of branches, reinforcing the sense of camaraderie within the wider Ulysses community.

I would like to thank all members for the stories they have contributed over the years to the Odyssey magazine. From 2026, we will no longer be producing a printed magazine and will instead continue with a monthly e-newsletter, available on our website. The e-newsletter will be published in the first week of each month, and we are currently seeking a member who may be interested in taking on this role. I will continue to run the raffle in 2026 and have already begun sourcing prizes.

I would also like to thank the committee and all those who volunteer their time to help keep the branch running smoothly.

I look forward to another successful and enjoyable year ahead for the Adelaide Branch in 2026.

## **Treasurer's Annual Report 2026**

I am pleased to present the Treasurer's Report for the Adelaide Branch for the financial year ending 31 December 2025.

Overall, the branch remains in a sound financial position. Total income for the year amounted to **\$14,751.35**, derived primarily from events activity, quarterly muster Ulysses gear, Odyssey magazine income, raffles, and donations. GST collected during the period totalled **\$1,226.26**.

Total expenditure for the year was **\$13,869.25**, with the main expenses relating to club activities, Ulysses gear purchases, Odyssey magazine costs, raffle expenses, donations, and meeting costs. GST paid for the year totalled **\$1,254.97**, with a small GST refund of **\$28.71** recorded.

This resulted in an **operating surplus of \$882.10** for the year.

As at **31 December 2025**, the Adelaide Branch held a bank balance of **\$4,967.93**.

All financial records have been maintained accurately and transparently, and the accounts have been prepared in accordance with Ulysses Club requirements.

I would like to thank the committee for their support throughout the year and the members for their continued contribution to the financial stability of the branch.

## Website Administrator Report

Our website continues, same as last year. Still using WordPress and still running on the cheap hosting that we've (almost) always had. They fixed the SSL certificate issue we suffered last year. A reminder that we continually put up photos of rides, events, breakfasts etc in the website Gallery. These don't pop up in your face like Facebook posts do, so it's easy to forget they happen.

For Sunday rides, a link to a map of the ride appears in the relevant photo page as well. Just in case riders want to know where they've been. A GPX file of each ride recorded, is available if anyone wants it. (Maurice and I capture the ride info, depending on who is on the ride.) All our Odyssey magazines and newsletters are on our website and will remain there while the website exists. The [ulyssesau.org](http://ulyssesau.org) website is no more. It was started by me, to host websites for branches that wanted them after NatCom closed down all their branch sites, and to run a forum for all Australian Ulyssians. I ended up with no branches wanting a website on that host, and forum posts dwindling to zero. The Adelaide Branch website still serves all SA branches, in providing the combined SA calendars page (<https://ulyssesadelaide.org.au/calendars/?cal=SA>), information on the next SA Odyssey (<https://ulyssesadelaide.org.au/wp/sa-odyssey/>), and for branches that want it, an Odyssey online registration system.
