If you don't then do not ride immediately behind the ride leader. The system will work if adhered to and lets everyone ride with the confidence that they will not get lost or left behind. The ride leader is responsible for relaying the route to the group prior to leaving and - with the tail end Charlie - for knowing how many bikes are in the group. If you intend leaving or joining the ride at a particular point please let the ride leader and tail end Charlie know in advance.

News from Miss Jane

Hello,

We have been trying to find a way to make a difference in our local community for a while now and decided to provide baby mosquito net bed for newborns.

Infant mortality is very high here in PNG and malaria is one of the main causes. By keeping the mozzies away from the babies as much as possible, we know we can save lives.

At our local hospital there are on average 50 babies born every week. Taking into account the rural hospitals at Keravat and Nonga, plus the bush clinics, the total is closer to around 500 live births a month.

We have been very fortunate to find a local company who will import the baby beds for us on a regular basis at a very low cost. We ordered our first 1,000 in February and they are due to arrive Wednesday April 24th.

On going fund-raising is crucial so we can keep up supply.

The Kiwi Club in Port Moresby have kindly offered to pay for our first shipment.

We have been fund-raising by selling pancakes, sausage sizzles and gourmet hotdog drives at local events here and we are well on the way to funding the next shipment.

Future fund-raisers are scheduled at local football games & a fashion parade is being organised to be held in August.

Who are we?

We are a group of expat wives & volunteers residing in Kokopo, East New Britain Province PNG.

We have close ties with the expatriate doctors & midwives at the local and rural hospitals. They have been able to give us the information and feedback we need and also have become the point of distribution for the baby beds.

How can you help? Basically, for every 3 Australian dollars raised, we can provide a baby mosquito net bed.

We have no other costs every cent goes to purchasing more beds, our time is free.

We have attached some photos which we are happy for you to share with others.
